International headliners to rock the Brisbane Showgrounds

More than 30,000 people are expected to attend alternative music festival Good Things at the Brisbane Showgrounds this Sunday, when it returns following a two year hiatus.

The event will be headlined by one of the UK's most successful rock bands Bring Me The Horizon, along with American Grammy Award-winners Deftones.

Joining the line-up across the five live music stages will be punk favourites NOFX, Japanese rockers One Ok Rock and Australia's own TISM who will perform for the first time in 19 years.

Brisbane up-and-coming band Apate will also take to the stage, after winning the local section of the Good Things battle of the bands competition.

The popular music festival has been held at the Showgrounds since it first toured Australia in 2018, but wasn't able to go ahead in 2020 and 2021 due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Brisbane Showgrounds General Manager of Venue Sales and Marketing Jago Coyle said Good Things will be the last music festival at the Showgrounds this year.

"We've had a very successful spring / summer music festival season so far, with four major festivals taking place since late September attracting a total of 120,000 people," Mr Coyle said.

"Next year we welcome Wildlands on January 7, St Jerome's Laneway Festival in early February and new heavy metal festival Knotfest in March."

Gates to Good Things open at midday, with limited tickets still available online.

The Brisbane Showgrounds precinct is located 1.5km from Brisbane's CBD and is Queensland's largest indoor/outdoor events site. Visit <u>www.brisbaneshowgrounds.com.au</u>.
