The St Jeromés Laneway Festival lineup is Lit!

Summer music festivals are still rocking at the Brisbane Showgrounds – this time the St Jerome's Laneway Festival will bring an all-star line-up of international and Australian acts this Saturday.

In another celebration of music, the 19th edition of St Jerome's Laneway will be headlined by hot UK rapper Stormzy along with Steve Lacy; Dominic Fike, AJ Tracey, Angie McMahon, Confidence Man D4VD, Dope Lemon, Eyedress, Faye Webster and Horsegirl.

Other artists set to star include Nia Archives, Paris Texas, Raye, Skin on Skin, Suki Waterhouse, Teenage Dads, Unknown Mortal Orchestra, Blondshell, DOMi & JD Beck, Hemlocke Springs, Miss Kaninna, JK-47, Pretty Girl and Vacations.

Around 22,000 people are expected to pack the Brisbane Showgrounds for Laneway's first festival on its six-city Australia New Zealand circuit. The 24 acts will perform on four stages across the Showgrounds.

The forward-thinking music festival is known for securing big name artists just as they break into stardom.

Brisbane Showgrounds General Manager of Venue Sales and Marketing Jago Coyle said it was fantastic to welcome Laneway for its 14th festival at the Showgrounds.

"We've been hosting the Brisbane leg of Laneway since 2008 and we're proud of our long-standing relationship with the popular festival," Mr Coyle said.

"Laneway always brings memorable moments to music fans at our venue, including megastar Lorde performing in 2014 and Grammy Award-winner Flume entertaining the crowds in 2016.

Laneway is a 16+ event, with gates opening 11.30am.
